Cargo Manifest Manual

USER MANUAL

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1. Definitions

- a) The manifest document consists of two (2) segments, namely:
 - i. The Manifest General Segment
 - ii. The Waybill Segment.

- b) The term “**Waybill**” is intended to be generic. It covers a broad range of transport documents such as Airway Bills and Bills of Lading. The waybills can either be House Bills or Master Bills.

- c) “**Bill of Lading**” (BOL) is a document issued by a carrier which details a shipment of merchandise and gives title of that shipment to a specified party.

- d) A “**House Bill**” represents one consignment and is issued by a forwarder. The goods related to it can be cleared directly by a customs declaration(s).

- e) A “**Master Bill**” refers to a consolidation of goods for transport purpose, of several house bills and it must be deconsolidated before Customs clearance, so that a Customs declaration relates to it.

- f) A “**first level Bill of Lading**” is directly related to the manifest and it can be a House Bill or a Master Bill.

- g) A “**second level Bill of Lading**” can either be a master or a house bill created by the degroupage of a master and is linked directly to a first level Master Waybill.

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- h) **“XML or Extensible Markup Language”**, is an encoding that is both human and machine readable for XML Upload for Carrier, **Non Vessel Operator Common Carrier; NVOCC** (CO-Loader).
- i) **“Split BL”** This option divides a house bill into multiple lines for different types of packages or goods. It is different than a deconsolidation.
- j) **“Authorise Splitting”** The carrier agent or CO-Loader must access the manifest and give permission to consolidator(s) and declarant(s) to split the waybill and must be validated so that it can be used in a customs declaration. To validate the waybill select the waybill which have been split from the list of bills of lading,
- k) **“Agent Release”** is performed by either the carrier agent or consolidator respectively to release the waybill and to allow the information to be entered for the Customs declaration.
- l) **“Outturn report conforms”** this option is used when the tally of cargo carried on the vessel/aircraft is correct.
- m) **“Outturn report non-conforms”** this option is used when the tally of cargo carried on the vessel/aircraft is incorrect.
- n) **“CO-Loader”** refers to the Shipping agent or NVOCC: Non Vessel Operator Common Carrier, who is allowed to share cargo on the vessel assigned by the Carrier.
- o) **“CO-Loader Validation of waybills”** is performed by the CO-Loader to permit the information in the system to be entered on the Customs declaration.

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- p) **“Authorise Degroupage”** gives permission to the consolidator to degroup the waybills.

- q) **“Validating Degroupage”** this option is used by the consolidator after the deconsolidation of the master waybill is completed. It can only be used after the carrier agent has granted the agent release.

- r) **“Waybill grouping”** relates to the groupage of cargo which would have been carried on different flights/vessels with the same waybill reference and consolidated into a single manifest.

- s) **“Amendment”** relates to an application to the Comptroller of Customs & Excise Saint Lucia for any changes necessary. Whether to be done on a registered manifest; waybill or any other segment of the registered manifest. Approval must be granted to effect changes of information to these documents in the system.

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2. Creating A Manifest General Segment

There are two options available to users to capture a manifest:

- i. **Manual capture** refers to data manually key in the system and is normally used by small carriers.
- ii. **XML Integration** is where an XML file from the carrier's system is uploaded into ASYCUDA World. It is recommended for large carriers.

Manual Capture

Accessing the General Segment via Document Library

Upon receipt of the principal manifest the user will input the data into ASYCUDA World. The manifest creation starts with the **General Segment**. Access the General Segment by navigating the Document Library using this path:

ASYCUDA >>> Cargo Manifest >>> Manifest Data Capture >>> Manual Capture >>> Manifest




Figure 1: Manifest Capture Shortcut

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- i. Right click the shortcut “Manifest” and select the option “New” to open a blank manifest




FIGURE 2: New manifest capture

The system will present the user with the Manifest General Segment as illustrated in figure 3.

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Use the manifest field guide to insert all necessary data. In some cases, reference data is provided from a drop down list or from the finder (using the F3 Key or FN + F3 combination).

Kindly Note that all Mandatory Fields are shown **Red** if not completed or if the data entered is invalid.

ASYCUDA uses the **OFFICE CODE, VOYAGE NUMBER AND DATE OF DEPARTURE** to uniquely identify the manifest.




Figure 4: Manifest document menu

The *verify* command allows the system to check the document for errors. If errors are detected the system returns a message list. Clicking the individual error lines within the message list moves the cursor to the field with the erroneous or missing data.

All errors must be corrected and the document re-verified until the “Document Verified” message is displayed.

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<p>iii. Store the manifest:</p>	<p>After verifying the manifest general segment page data, use the  icon to store the manifest.</p>

The system will display the message “Store is done” also displaying three icons. These icons presents the user with the following options:



Permits the user to continue working on the stored manifest to add waybills.



Permits the user to “view” the stored manifest general segment page.



Will close all windows displayed and complete the transaction.

Click the  icon to continue with this manifest, by adding the waybills.

3. Adding Waybills to the Stored Manifest

Continue working on the stored manifest to add waybill(s).

<p>i. Add waybills to the stored manifest</p>	<p>To add a bill of lading click on the Bol tab at the bottom of the manifest page. Within the top menu of this page click the  icon. The system will display a prompt confirming the creation of a waybill.</p>

Click the  icon to confirm and continue.



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A waybill page will appear with the information from the General Segment already inserted. It will include the OFFICE OF ENTRY, VOYAGE NUMBER and DEPARTURE DATE, meaning the waybill is linked to the manifest general segment.

- ii. Complete the waybill information

Mandatory fields will be highlighted RED if the required information is either missing or if invalid.

- iii. Continue by inputting the relevant information into the required fields. The “Manifest Field Guide – Bill of lading segment” may be used as a reference.
- iv. After completing the relevant field

data click the  icon to verify the data. If any errors are detected, the system will display the error message window. If no errors are found, the system will display the “document verified” message.

- v. Close the message and click the  icon. The system will display the “store done” message.




Figure 8: Manifest general segment page

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vi. To continue adding waybills to the stored manifest click the  icon.

To return to the manifest general segment page and finalise the manifest, click the  icon.

4. Adding CO-Loaders

A Carrier may allow “Non Vessel Operator Common Carrier” or CO-Loaders to place cargo on the vessel. To do so the Carrier Agent must add the CO-Loader(s) to the manifest thereby permitting the CO-Loaders to add their Bills Of Lading to the Manifest. ASYCUDA allows this option in the “CO-Loaders” interface through the “CO-Loaders tab which is located at the bottom of the Manifest page.




Figure 10: CO-Loader interface screen

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The process:

- i. Select the CO-Loader(s) from the “List of Carrier Agents” and use the green  icon to add the name to the “List of authorized CO-Loaders”




Figure 11: CO-Loader selection option

N.B. To delete a CO-Loader(s) from the “List of authorized CO-Loaders” right click the required name from the table and select the “Delete” option.




Figure 12: CO-Loader interface screen

- ii. On completion of the transfer use the  icon or  icon to save changes.

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N.B. The Carrier Agent must permit the CO-Loader(s) to add their bills of lading before registering the manifest.

5. Amending a Stored Manifest General Segment

- i. Retrieve the **stored** manifest

Use the following Path: **ASYCUDA >>> Cargo Manifest >>> Manifest Data Capture >>> Manual Capture >>> Manifest.**

- ii. Right click on the find option.




Figure 13: Manifest finder option

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The manifest finder will be displayed. (Use of the finder is explained on pages 27 & 28 of this manual).

- III. Insert the search criteria and select the  icon. Usually, the search criterion for finding a “STORED” Manifest is the unique reference for **OFFICE CODE, VOYAGE NUMBER** and **DATE OF DEPARTURE**.




Figure 14: Manifest finder

- iv. Right click on the desired manifest in the search result and select the option “Modification”.




Figure 15: Manifest modification option

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Modify General Segment

- v. The manifest General Segment will be displayed and the necessary changes can be made.

Confirm and save changes

- vi. In the document tool bar/ menu select the verify  icon to verify the document. If no errors are displayed, select the  icon to “Save” any changes to the document.

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6. Adding Waybills to a Stored General Segment/Manifest

A Waybill can be added to a manifest in two ways:

1. The user can follow the process outlined in **Section 3 (I – V) “Adding Waybills to the stored manifest”** or by,
2. Right click and selecting the option **“New”** under the pathway **“ASYCUDA >>> Cargo Manifest >>> Manifest Data Capture >>> Manual Capture >>> Waybill”**

Selecting the “New” option will open a blank waybill for completion.




Figure 17: New waybill option

Complete a blank Waybill

- i. Input the Office Code, Voyage Number and the Date Of Departure of the Stored Manifest. Once completed with valid data, the General Segment of the Waybill will be automatically populated with information from the Manifest.
- ii. Complete the other sections of the waybill and click the  icon in the document tool bar. If no errors are displayed, click the  icon to save changes and store the waybill.
- iii. This process can be repeated to add multiple waybills. The green arrow may also be used.

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7. Adding Waybills to a Manifest as a CO-Loader

The CO-Loader will access the “New” Waybill option by navigating the Document library and using the path: **“ASYCUDA >>> Cargo Manifest >>> Manifest Data Capture >>> Manual Capture >>> Waybill”**

Open a blank Waybill

- i. Right click at waybill and select the option “New”
- ii. Input the Office Code, Voyage Number and the Date of Departure of the manifest.
- iii. The waybill general segment page will be automatically populated with details from the manifest. This will include the Carrier, Registration Number, Waybill type and Line. This means that the waybill is linked to the general segment of the manifest.
- iv. Insert the “Master Waybill” reference for degroupage in the “Previous Document Field” and complete the other sections of the waybill.
- v. On completion, verify the document, then store to the server.
- vi. Continue the process by repeating steps I – V or clicking the green arrow displayed after storing the waybill.




Figure 20: New waybill option

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8. Adding Containers to a Waybill

If the arriving cargo is containerised, select the container tab as shown in **Figure 22** to access the container segment. Click the tab labelled Containers.




Figure 23: Container page

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The container segment will appear as illustrated in **Figure 23**. Add the container information in the fields as required. See the manifest fields guide for information.

After keying in all the details for the container **do not** verify the document at this time. Doing so will clear all information entered for the container. However **click** the  icon (**Add a new Container**) to **add** the container to the table list. See figure 24 below.

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To modify or remove the information entered for a container, **right-click** the container line in the table and select the appropriate option presented. The option “remove” will remove the container information from the list. The system will prompt the user with a confirmation



message, select the green tick to accept. The “update” option allows the user to update the container information. After the update has been completed, select the (update container)  icon to add it back to the table list.

After keying in all information into the container page, verify the document. If no errors are presented, store or save changes to the waybill.

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9. Adding Vehicles to a Waybill

If the arriving cargo is a vehicle or vehicles, select the vehicle tab as shown in **Figure 26** to access the vehicle segment. Click the tab labelled vehicle.


The vehicle segment will appear as illustrated in **Figure 27**. Add the vehicle(s) information in the fields as required.

After keying in the vehicle information, selecting one of the following options will perform the following:

-  This option will add the vehicle to the vehicle list table.
-  This option will allow the user to retrieve a vehicle added to the table list and update its information. The user selects the  option again to save the updated information.

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-  This option permits the user to cancel an update. The system will return the vehicle information to the list table without effecting any changes.
-  This option will delete the selected vehicle information from the list table.

After keying in all information into the vehicle page, verify the document. If no errors are presented, store or save changes to the waybill.

N.B. The minimum information required to add a vehicle to a waybill is the Chassis Number, Make and Condition (New/Used).

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10. Splitting a Waybill

A house waybill may be split into different lines according to package type or commodities. This must not be confused with degroupage where you have many consignees.

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
The waybill split process is explained below:

- I. Select the “**Split tab**” as shown in **Figure 28** and input the necessary information. When the goods being split are from a container, the system will prompt the user with the following message



Select the green tick when the goods in this line will be discharged from the container. Otherwise select no.

- II. Select the  icon in the document menu to add the line information in the list table below.
- III. To **update** or **remove** a specific split line from the list table, right click the line and select the appropriate option. The system will display



 on the selected line. Make the necessary

- IV. **Verify** the information entered by clicking the  icon in the document menu. If no errors are found






Figure 29: Waybill split page

- V. Select the  icon in the document menu to add the line information in the list below.
- VI. To **Remove or Update** a specific split line from the list, right click the line and select the appropriate option. The system will display  on the selected line. Make the necessary corrections and click the  icon to add the updated line back to the list
- VII. **Verify** the information entered by clicking the  icon in the document menu. If no errors are found proceed to save the changes to the waybill.
- VIII. N.B. The split must be **validated** by the Carrier Agent or Consolidator. **The Split Validation can only be performed after the manifest has been registered.** To validate the split, retrieve the waybill using the waybill finder (use of the finder is explained on page 29). Input the manifest **Office code, Voyage Number, Date of Departure** and **Waybill Reference** into the finder and right click the waybill. The option  should be selected.

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- IX. Once the split has been validated, the “Agent Release” function must be performed by either the Carrier Agent or the Consolidator. This will release the waybill and allow the information to be entered for a Customs declaration.

11. Amending a Stored Waybill

A **Waybill** can be amended in two ways:

- I. One way is to access the waybill from the manifest. N.B. This option is only available to Carrier Agents and CO-Loaders.
- II. The other option is done by locating the waybill with the finder.

Using option number one, perform the following from within an open manifest. Click the  to get the list of Bills of Lading.

The system will display the list of Bills of Lading that are on the manifest.




Figure 30: Waybill page

Right click the desired waybill to reveal the options shown in **figure 30**. Select the “Modification” option to retrieve the stored waybill for changes.

N.B. A “**stored**” waybill can also be deleted using this option.

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Using option number two. Access the document library and navigate to the following path:

ASYCUDA >> Cargo Manifest >> Manifest Data Capture >> Manual Capture >> Waybill

Right-click the shortcut “Waybill” to reveal the function menu shown in **Figure 31**.

From the menu, select “**Find**”. The system will display the finder. Use of the finder is explained below. *Skip to pages 29 & 30 to continue the waybill modification process if necessary.*

The Document Finder Explained

The **finder** is a powerful search tool used throughout ASYCUDA. It provides the user with multiple options with which to retrieve documents on the server. It is divided into four columns. They are **1.Name 2. Criteria 3. Value #1 and 4. Value #2**.

Each Finder type will list the applicable fields for the document type within the **Name** column. Example **Manifest Finder** or **Waybill Finder**. The user is permitted to select various search **Criteria** options which suit the type of information inserted into the adjacent **Value #1 & #2** columns. Example if the information inserted into the said columns are exact, the criteria option selected should be “**equals**”. If the user is uncertain as to the exact values, he/she may select options such as “**starts with**” or “**contains substring**” and inserting the starting values or part of the values respectively.




Figure 32: Waybill Finder with criteria

In **figure 32** the criteria “**equals**” has been selected and the exact values have been keyed into the adjacent value fields.

By clicking the  icon at the bottom of the finder window or F3 key, the system will retrieve all records which match the criteria entered.




Figure 33: Waybill Finder where no records were found

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If no records matching the selected criteria or the values are found or if the values keyed in are invalid, the system will display an error message. See **Figure 33**.

Figure 33 shows an example where the finder was unable to retrieve any records based on the search criteria and the values entered by the user.

In such cases the user will be required to confirm the selected criteria and or values, make the necessary changes then retry the search.




Figure 34: Waybill Finder with record found

Figure 34 shows the result of the finder retrieving one record matching the criteria used in **Figure 33**. Should the user require a change to the search criteria, clicking the  icon would return the finder to the search page.

Once the waybill(s) have been retrieved by the finder, right-click the line to reveal the function menu. The option **“Modification”** will be listed for **“Stored”** waybills. Selecting this option will retrieve the waybill screen.

The user will be permitted to **“Delete”** the **“Stored”** waybill or make changes, after which a verification check will be required. If no errors are displayed, the waybill changes may be saved.

N.B. use of this modification option will not update the Manifest General Segment page.

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12. Registering a Stored Manifest

ASYCUDA allows two options to “Register” a manifest. They are listed below

- II. Direct Register
- III. Registration from a manifest opened on screen.

The “Direct Register” option:

Using the document Manifest Finder, navigate to the following path:

ASYCUDA >> Cargo Manifest >>
Manifest Data Capture >> Manual
Capture >> Manifest

Right-click the “Manifest” shortcut to reveal the function menu.

Select the option “Find”.

The system will display the “Manifest Finder”. Use of the “Document Finder” is explained in detail on pages 27 & 28 of this manual.

Using the finder, enter the relevant details in the search fields and retrieve the manifest.

Once the manifest is found, right-click the record and select the option “Direct Register” as seen in Figure 36.

If any errors are found on the “Manifest” or its “Waybills” during this process, the system will display them in an error message window. See figure 37. The error message displayed shows a conflict between the number of waybills listed in the “Manifest general segment” and those attached in the “Bol” tab.




Figure 35: Manifest Finder in the document library




Figure 36: Direct Register option as seen in the manifest finder

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Once all the errors are rectified, the “Direct Register” option may once again be used to register the manifest.

Registration from an “opened” manifest:




Figure 39: Manifest Document Menu

When working on an opened manifest, either during the completion process of a new manifest or after retrieving it from storage on the ASYCUDA server using the finder, the user will be required to verify the document for errors using the  option found in the document menu. See figure 39.

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13. Outturn reports

Discrepancies may be discovered during the cargo tally process. In such instances where the cargo reported on the manifest is found to be more or less than the tally, or other anomalies are discovered, the Carrier Agent is required to amend the manifest to reflect the changes. However, before any such amendments can be done to the manifest, an electronic **“Outturn Report”** must first be submitted to The Comptroller of Customs via the system.

Outturn report conform: Indicates that no differences were found between the manifest report and the cargo tally and no amendments are required.

Outturn report – non conform: This indicates that the result of the tally of the cargo was found to be different from the manifest report and permission has been granted to submit amendments.

Using the Manifest Finder (**use of the finder is explained on pages 27 – 28 of this user manual**) the user is required to retrieve the registered manifest.

The user is required to right-click the appropriate manifest record to reveal the function menu. Various options will be visible, however the **“Outturn Report not conform”** should be selected to begin the amendment process.




Figure 41: Function menu of manifest showing the outturn report

The system will display a message window confirming the submission of the **“Outturn Report”**. See **Figure 42**. The **Manifest Office Code, Registration Year and Registration Number** will also be displayed in the message.

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14. Amending a Registered Manifest

Carrier Agents, CO-Loaders and Consolidators are allowed to modify a registered manifest and its waybill(s) through the amendment option. However permission must be sought from the Comptroller of Customs to make such amendments after registration.

The amendment process is as follows:

In the document library, navigate to the following path:

ASYCUDA >> Cargo Manifest >> Manifest Data Capture >> Manual Capture >> Cargo Amend.

Right-click the short cut “Cargo Amend” and select “New” to create an application as shown in **figure 42**.

The system will invoke the “Cargo Amend Request” document for completion by the user. See **figure 43**. Please Note that only one amendment type can be done at a time. Therefore where multiple amendments are required, the user will have to submit them separately.

The applicant is required to complete the initial fields listed below:

1. **Customs Office** – Border office where the vessel or aircraft discharged the cargo.
2. **Manifest Registration** – Insert the year and registration number assigned to the manifest when registered.
3. **Shipping Agent** – Insert the code of the Carrier Agent, CO-Loader or Consolidator responsible for requesting the modification to the manifest.
4. **Type of amendment(s)** – The system allows the applicant to select **multiple options** according to the type of modification request being submitted.
5. **Reason for amendments** – A free text field which affords the applicant the option to provide details regarding the request.
6. **Attached document** – The applicant may be required to provide supporting documentation for the request. Such documents maybe scanned and uploaded in this section of the application.

The amendment request permits the applicant to modify **one** manifest at a time. However, as stated above, multiple modification types may be chosen. According to the types selected, the system will open the corresponding tab(s) or segments at the bottom of the amendment page. See **figure 44**.




Figure 45: Manifest amendment segment




Figure 46: Manifest amendment segment with changes

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



Once selected this option will invoke the “Add Bol” tab/segment: The system will open the “Request to Add Waybills” page and grant the following options:

1. Office Code – The system will display the office code for the manifest. This information is inherited from the request page of the amendment.
2. Voyage Number – The system will display the manifest’s voyage number. This information is inherited from the request page of the amendment.
3. Date of Departure – The system will display the manifest’s date of departure. This information is inherited from the request page of the amendment.
4. Bl.reference – The applicant is required to insert the characters for the reference for the new bill of lading into this field.




Figure 53: Add New Bill of lading reference segment




Figure 54: Add New Bill of lading reference segment with changes




Figure 55: Add New Bill of lading reference segment showing the options: 1.Add BL to reg. manifest 2.Delete




Figure 56: Blank Bill of lading invoked for completion.




Figure 58: Add BL to registered manifest amendment page






Figure 64: New Waybill Option.

The user is required to complete all applicable fields of the waybill form. The “Manifest Field Guide – Bill of lading segment” may be used as a reference. N.B. All degrouped Waybills must be equal to the following: Master Bill of Lading quantity of packages, weight, total number of containers (including total container packages), total number of vehicles etc.

On completing the waybill the user must verify the accuracy of the information entered, correct any errors displayed by the system then save the Waybill by selecting the  option in the menu.

The system will display the “Store done” message. The user may select the  option. This will open a new blank Waybill for completion. However if all Waybills have been added for degroupage, the user is required to select  to close the message.

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Validating the degroupage.

The user is required to complete degroupage process through validation. This will permit the write-off of the degrouped Waybills. However the shipping agent must have provided the “**Agent Release**” to allow for the validation of the degroupage. Once this has been granted.

Navigate the document library to the following path:

ASYCUDA >>> Cargo Manifest >>> Manifest Data Capture >>>Manual Capture >>>Waybill

Right Click the shortcut “Waybill” and select the option “Find”.

At the finder screen, insert the Master Waybill Reference into the B/L Reference field and select the search icon.




Figure 67: Waybill Find option




Figure 68: Waybill Finder




Figure 69: Validate Degroupage option




Figure 71: Full Cargo Integration dialog box

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


Figure 72: XML document search dialog box




Figure 73: Valid xml content message




Figure 74: Successful integration message




Figure 75: Degroupage Integration option




Figure 76: Degroupage Integration dialog box

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


Figure 77: XML document search dialog box




Figure 78: Valid xml content message




Figure 79: Successful integration message




Figure 80: Waybills location shortcut




Figure 82: Waybills Location dialog box showing manifest data




Figure 83: Selected waybill added the list




Figure 86: Waybills location message




Figure 87: Full cargo print option




Figure 89: Print all waybills option
